## Advanced Learning Spaces:

### Common Course Structure under NEP

All Undergraduate Programmes are designed in accordance with the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, promoting **flexibility, interdisciplinarity, skill development, and holistic education**.

The curriculum is structured into the following components:

Component	Description
<b>A. Major (Core Discipline)</b>	The Major forms the primary area of study chosen by the student. It provides in-depth knowledge and specialization in a particular discipline and progresses from foundational to advanced levels across semesters.
<b>B. Minor (Interdisciplinary Learning)</b>	The Minor enables students to study a secondary discipline alongside their Major, encouraging interdisciplinary learning and academic flexibility.
<b>C. AEC (Ability Enhancement Courses)</b>	Focuses on language and communication skills, enhancing students' reading, writing, and speaking abilities for academic and professional contexts.
<b>D. SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses)</b>	Designed to impart practical and job-oriented skills, improving employability and hands-on competencies.
<b>E. VAC (Value Added Courses)</b>	Aims at holistic development, promoting ethical awareness, sustainability, well-being, and personal growth beyond academics.
<b>F. MC (Multidisciplinary Courses)</b>	Allows students to explore subjects beyond their core discipline, fostering cross-disciplinary exposure, innovation, and critical thinking.

Candidates applying for admission under reserve categories shall be required to submit a valid certificate to that effect issued by the Officer of the rank of the Deputy Collector or any other authorized Officer as notified by the Government of Goa.

*Seats falling vacant under any of the above reserved categories shall be filled from the general category candidates with the approval of the Vice Chancellor.*

## ADMISSION TO F.Y BA & B.COM

### Eligibility

1. The candidate must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board or any recognized equivalent board.
2. The qualification must correspond to Level 4 of the National Education Framework
3. Special Cases - Candidates not covered under the standard eligibility criteria may apply. Their eligibility will be determined by the Vice-Chancellor, in consultation with:  
Dean of the concerned Faculty  
Chairperson(s) of the Board(s) of Studies

### Migration / Lateral Entry

1. Students migrating from another recognized University may be admitted based on credits earned in relevant subjects.
2. Admission is subject to the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) regulations of Goa University.
3. Final eligibility will be determined by the competent academic authorities.

### Multiple Entry–Exit Provisions (NEP)

Students exiting and re-entering the programme are eligible as follows:

1. UG Certificate Holders: Eligible for admission to Semester III within 3 years of exit
2. UG Diploma Holders: Eligible for admission to Semester V within 3 years of exit

### Intake Capacity

1. An additional 10% seats may be permitted by the University to accommodate requests for change of Major, wherever applicable.
2. Vacant or unfilled seats, if any, shall be allocated to students opting for a change of Major, subject to availability.
3. Preference for change of Major shall be given to students who have secured a higher CGPA, and have no backlogs in the First Year.
